

PARA Outdoor Adventures program is currently offering many new and exciting opportunities in Outdoor Recreation that includes classes set in beautiful greenspaces, eco-tourism, and international eco-travel. Here are some of PARA's Outdoor Classes, Day Trips, and Epic Outdoor Trips to look forward to.

Canoeing 101 is the class to take to learn guidelines for open-water environments while using small watercraft like canoes, kayaks and paddleboards. It covers everything from trip planning to deep water t-rescues. This class takes place in September at the beautiful Lake Nicol in Tuscaloosa, AL. NASP Archery Classes are available for October and November at the Tuscaloosa Community Archery Range. This class offers instructions on the eleven steps to archery success and opens the door to a recreational skill you can enjoy for a lifetime. Climbing Clinics are offered if you are interested in entering the world of rock climbing, bouldering and belaying. This threeday class starts out with the basics visiting two different indoor climbing gyms and ends with an outdoor bouldering trip to the beautiful and majestic Bama Rock Gardens. Bama Rock Gardens, also known as BRG, is a wealth of greenspace that is not currently accessible through eco-tourism but is available for exclusive use through PARA Outdoor Classes. BRG offers the unique Boyles Limestone cliffs and canyons that are ideal for bouldering and rock climbing.

If you are ready for a little more excitement there is nothing like kayaking down the Coosa River in DeKalb County, GA. This trip is planned for October and features Moccasin Gap which has Class II rapids on the left and for the thrill seekers, a Class III rapid on the right that, if you survive without turning over, is sure to get the adrenaline pumping. If you happen to be running a little short on your steps, PARA has an Appalachian Trail section hike from Forney Ridge to Clingman's Dome in North Carolina Smokey Mountains. This 11.2 mile hike will offer challenging terrain and add in the element of overnight camping in the backcountry shelters.

There are many extremists and enthusiast that have a global love of nature. That is why PARA is offering the Kenai & Denali Trekking Tour over the great Harding Icefields, rugged forest hikes, and a mountain tour of Denali, Alaska. If the icefields are not your thing, jump on the Incan Trail Express to Machu Picchu, Peru. This trip will include a train ride to the majestic ruins of Machu Picchu and a hike up the Quarry Trail. Finally, PARA is offering a Galapagos Island Hopping trip to Ecuador. Enjoy the wildlife highlight of the Galapagos while traveling by boat to various islands and hiking on rocky volcanic terrain that is sure to be an event of a lifetime.

With this much wonder in the world of nature, don't miss out on any opportunity to learn, explore, and participate in the beauty of the outdoors.

Sylacauga Parks & Recreation

The Sylacauga Parks & Recreation is actively working to grow our outdoor recreation and tourism economy through the implementation of several activities at our Lake Howard park. Nestled in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains at the southern tip of the Talladega National Forest rests Lake Howard, our local watershed. A 134 acre recreational fishing lake that was constructed in 1954 to not only supply water to the city of Sylacauga but also help with flood control and provide recreational opportunities for residents and visitors to the area. Sylacauga Parks and Recreation manages the facility which offers opportunities for fishing, hiking, mountain biking, kayak/canoeing and will soon open its new 18 hole Disc Golf course. Amenities at the park include picnic pavilions, restrooms, a boat ramp, kayak/canoe launch, multiple fishing piers and covered boat storage slips that are available for rent. Lake Howard is also home to the Sylaward Trail, a 14-mile stacked loop trail system offering

opportunities for hiking, trail running and mountain biking. With scenic views of both Lake Howard, Little Wills Lake, and miles of buff single track, it is a favorite "hidden gem" for outdoor enthusiasts. Being only a stones throw from the Pinhoti Trail and the vast miles of gravel forest service roads, it has become the home for many cycling and cross country endurance events that bring participants from all over the country to test their metal against the course. With the rise in popularity of disc golf, Lake Howard is currently constructing an eighteen hole Disc Golf course that is promised to challenge the player on many levels. Offering short and long tee boxes and opportunities for multiple basket placement, this course is destined to be a favorite with its varying terrain and scenic views of the lake. (Tentative opening date in the fall of 2023.) Most recently, we hosted a mountain bike race with 100 contestants and the Rebecca Mountain 50-mile Trail Run with 100 contestants at Sylaward Trail.

Dothan Leisure Services

Dothan Leisure Services (DLS) Youth Tackle Football participants will be taking the field this season in brand new, state of the art, Xenith football equipment and Augusta uniforms. What's even better is the equipment and uniforms were donated free of charge to DLS by Xenith and Augusta via their partnership with RCX Sports and Izell Reese. Since the beginning of its Youth Tackle Football program, DLS has purchased and provided football equipment and uniforms to all participants at great cost while keeping registration fees for the program low. DLS staff had been having internal discussions for several years about finding the best way to move out of the role of equipment rental and storage due to liability concerns, storage constraints, and escalating costs. These concerns were mentioned to Izell Reese by staff, and he went to work immediately to put this tremendous opportunity together. And, as an added bonus to eliminating the expense of equipment and uniforms, Dothan Leisure Services was able to offer a 7- & 8-year-old age division and register enough players to field two 7- & 8-year-old teams. Dothan plays in the Wiregrass Youth Football Association,

along with Troy, Enterprise, Ozark, Brundidge, and Luverne, and fields two teams in the 12U, 10U and 8U divisions.

Dothan Leisure Services (DLS) has increasingly put an emphasis on events, which is a great way for the community to gather, have a great time, and raise awareness and funds for local charities. A swell of popularity that DLS has been able to build on is the central role that pets, especially dogs, increasingly play in people's lives. Our goal has been to host one outdoor, dog-themed event each quarter to give our citizens and their pups a variety of activities to participate in throughout the year.

The fall dog event this year is the 3rd Annual Doggie Dip, which will take place September 16th at Water World Water Park. Just before the pools are drained and cleaned for the season, staff will set up the park for dogs to take the last splash. 
