




Tuscaloosa **The Pros of Turf Tank**

When PARA embarked on the quest to acquire a field painter, our approach was highly discerning, involving careful consideration and observation of numerous on-site demonstrations. In the end, our choice gravitated towards the Turf Tank. The experience, from the initial purchase to the subsequent installation and setup, has been exceptional in customer service.

Throughout the process, the representative was present on-site alongside our staff for two days, ensuring the intricate layout of our multi-use field was seamlessly programmed into the tablet and that the painter operated with precision. The flexibility of the paint flow, coupled with its adjustability to accommodate budget constraints, further impressed us.

Within the inaugural week of utilization, our staff was astounded by the substantial time savings afforded by the Turf Tank.

This newfound efficiency means we can focus on enhancing turf quality instead of laboring over traditional methods like pulling strings and marking fields. As we eagerly anticipate the upcoming spring season, our team is excited about the continued benefits and performance of our Turf Tank.





Where's Theodore?

For the past three years Opelika Parks and Recreation has offered "Where's Theodore", a free, virtually based program that encourages citizens to visit local parks and outdoor city spaces.

Each year, Theodore the Elf "creates mischief around Opelika, leaving ornaments in his wake". Opelika citizens are encouraged to hunt for Theodore's lost ornaments in order to receive a prize.

Theodore usually visits Opelika for five days (Monday-Friday) and manages to lose one ornament a day. Photos of Theodore and an ornament are posted to the OPR Facebook and Instagram pages daily to give citizens a clue of where to look that day.

Prizes typically consist of gift cards to local businesses and restaurants. Opelika Parks and Recreation often partners with businesses by hiding Theodore at their business in exchange for a gift card or prize.



Our Rec: RecDesk

At the City of Enterprise Parks and Recreation department, we take advantage of the RecDesk software. We use RecDesk daily. With this program we are able to allow the community to sign up for our youth and adult programs online.

It also allows us to export information into an excel spreadsheet, keep track of payments, keep a calendar of youth sports, and we are able to utilize it to send out mass emails for registration information and our monthly newsletters. Technology has also played a huge part in knowing the number of attendees at our events. This year, we reached out to a company to get visitor demographics from mobile mapping for two of our largest free community events which allowed us to get an estimated number of attendees. We held Festival in the Park in May, and the number of attendees were over 10,000 people. Furthermore, we held Spooky in the Park in October which had over 5,000 attendees, and it was only a three hour event.

Technology will only continue to advance and we look forward to utilizing it even more as it progresses.



In the News

Dothan Leisure Services recently renovated the computer lab at the Andrew Belle Community Center to provide enrichment through technology to the participants of the Summer Camp/Afterschool Program, access to technology to the citizens of Dothan, and an opportunity to pursue education opportunities through our partnership with Wallace Community College. The computer lab was furnished with 15 brand new computers with accompanying desks and chairs, a flat screen tv that serves as a SmartBoard, white board, and a teacher's desk station. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held on September 6, 2023, with representatives from our City Commission. Dothan Chamber of Commerce. and Wallace Community College.

Currently, the computer lab serves participants involved in the Afterschool Programs and participants enrolled in the Adult Education Classes. Adult Education Classes are held each Tuesday and Thursday night from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. Services for the Adult Education Classes are provided through a Certified Instructor of Wallace Community College. Participants work at their own pace with the help of the instructor to complete the coursework to earn their G.E.D. certificate. We are thrilled to launch the Open Computer Lab program in January 2024. The program will offer access to the computer lab to the citizens of Dothan, free of charge, for their personal, professional, and/or recreational use.

Dothan Leisure Services is excited and committed to implementing the use of technology through all our parks and recreation centers. Patrons now have access to view and register for any program, class, sport, and event through CivicRec. Our online system also allows patrons to rent our facilities and multi-use fields right at their fingertips.



Digiquatics Makes a Big Splash

We use Digiquatics daily in many aspects of Dothan Aquatics. Our staff utilizes this platform to log their water chemistry reports every 2 hours. It allows them to put in all the information, but also notes to management of anything we might need to know. We also utilize it to put in any maintenance requests and their level of urgency to our maintenance staff. Our lifeguard instructors utilize it to log our in-services with our lifeguard staff. Digiquatics gives access to chemical records, in-services, and maintenance work orders to all of our management staff in the palm of our hand at any time. It helps us keep accurate records and easily pull reports when needed.
